#### **TEXTING 9-1-1**

South Dakotans now have the option to text 911 when they're unable to make a 911 call.

The text, like a phone call, will be routed to a local dispatch center. The new texting option is part of the state's 9-1-1 Coordination Program.

Officials said texting should only be used when someone can't

safely make a voice call, such as in situations involving an active shooter, domestic violence or a home invasion. Texting to 911 can also be used by people who lose the ability to speak because of a medical crisis.

The South Dakota Department of Public Safety issued some guidelines, including first texting location and type of emergency. Photo or video texts cannot be received by dispatchers.

# CALL 811 BEFORE YOU DIG

Summer construction season is upon us, so remember to call SD One-Call before doing any digging for construction or home improvement projects. SD One-Call will help determine if there are any buried utility lines in your yard. The call is

free and there is no charge for the utilities to locate their facilities. By calling SD One-Call at least 48 hours before you dig, you can avoid costly bills that may be charged to you if facilities are cut. Calls to SD One-Call are answered 24 hours a day.

#### **INTERNET BROWSERS**

Have you given much thought to which internet browser you use? Many people go with whichever browser comes preloaded on their device, but there are things to consider when choosing one to use.

First, let's name a few of the options available: Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, Microsoft Edge, Internet Explorer and Opera are some of the most popular. It's worth noting that all the browsers let you bookmark pages and save passwords so you don't have to keep re-entering them. If that's all you want from a browser then there's no need to switch.

If you're thinking of changing yours, below are some of the features you may want to consider before deciding.

Google Chrome, probably the leading browser, by default signs you into Google services like Gmail and YouTube. You can also switch to dark mode, which makes browsing at night easier on the eyes.

Mozilla Firefox has the reputation of being the safest browser. It also has a Pocket button in the address bar, letting you save a page for later viewing anywhere with one click.

The Collections feature on Microsoft Edge presents a sidebar onto which you can drag webpages and images, write notes, and then share the whole assemblage to Excel or Word. Open windows are kept in vertical tabs, which you may like better than across the top.

Opera can convert currency just by highlighting the price and has a built-in ad blocker to stop adverts from following you. For gamers, check out Opera GX, specifically designed for you. Opera can tweak different settings to become light on the battery without sacrificing performance, extend the battery life of your laptop up to 50%.

Almost all of the browsers have reading mode, which can strip down formatting and leave only the basic information.

No matter which browser you are using, always make sure it is up to date. Updates are released for browsers as security flaws are discovered and new features are developed that need to be supported.
